### Where Do We Need Healing?

In this Sunday's gospel lesson we hear two stories of healing—one involved a little girl who had actually died, but Jesus raised her. The second one was an older woman who suffered from a chronic disease. They each faced very different situations, but Jesus heals them both with a touch. We too can feel the healing touch of God. It's not just a Jesus thing ... or a church thing. Healing touch is for everyone.

Indeed, a whole school of Asian healing art named Reiki is devoted to healing touch. Reiki is a Japanese technique for stress reduction and relaxation that also promotes healing. It is administered by "laying on hands" and is based on the idea that an unseen "life force energy" flows through us and is what causes us to be alive. If one's "life force energy" is low, then we are more likely to get sick or feel stress, and if it is high, we are more capable of being happy and healthy. The word Reiki is made of two Japanese words - Rei which means "God's Wisdom or the Higher Power" and Ki which is "life force energy". So Reiki is actually "spiritually guided life force energy."



Jesus' life force flowed from him into the two women he heals in today's gospel story and they were healed. Such touch today still heals our whole person including body, emotions, mind and spirit, creating many beneficial effects
