Following Jesus is Guerilla Warfare!

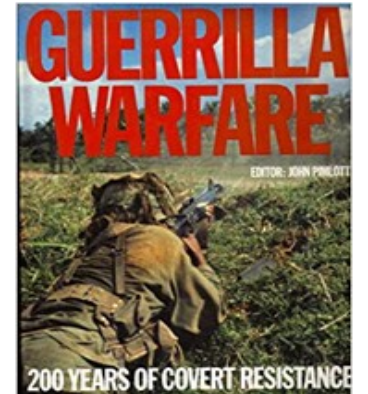
In this week's gospel lesson Jesus finds himself unappreciated in his own hometown, despite his far flung reputation and deeds of healing and power. Christ's response is to send out his disciples into the villages and countryside two by two- armed and fully supplied only with the compassion of God, nothing else.

God today is still calling and sending out subversive folk who look pretty harmless and ineffective on the surface.... but underneath us is the powerful and sometimes inexplicable compassion of God. This guerilla warfare tactic, especially good during these times when many folk think Christianity is about a bunch of rules and a narrowness of spirit, which says : "my way or the highway."

Surprise, surprise, surprise!

God's love is the very opposite of that caricature of Christianity.

God's love confirms, engulfs and expands who we are and how we respond to the world around us. God's
